Following is a brief summation of the 59<sup>th</sup> Convention of The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod of the North Dakota District for churches and

The theme for the 59<sup>th</sup> Convention of The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod of the North Dakota District was: "Rejoice in the Lord Always! Rejoice!" taken from Philippians 4:4-9: Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, rejoice. Let your reasonableness be known to everyone. The Lord is at hand; do not be anxious about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. Finally, brothers, whatever is true, whatever is honorable, whatever is just, whatever is pure, whatever is lovely, whatever is commendable, if there is any excellence, if there is anything worthy of praise, think about these things. What you have learned and received and heard and seen in me—practice these things, and the God of peace will be with you. (Philippians 4:4-9 esv)

# **Opening Divine Service**

Convention was opened with the Divine Service at Immanuel Lutheran Church, Fargo. Rev. Bernard Worral and Rev. Steve Schulz served as liturgists. Rev. Dr. Matthew Harrison, President of The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod, proclaimed the Word of *Rejoice! Rejoice in the Lord Always!* based on the convention theme verses. Convention offering to benefit Wittenberg Chapel was collected during the service in the amount of \$17,941.55.

# **Synod Representation**

Synod President Rev. Dr. Matthew Harrison presented a report on the Synod, and was available during the convention for conversation and fellowship. Synod regional vice president, Rev. Nabil Nour, was also present for the entirety of our convention. Rev. Dr. Jamison Hardy, English District President, was the convention parliamentarian. Rev. Dr. Jon Vieker, Associate Professor of Practical Theology and Dean of the Chapel at Concordia Seminary, Saint Louis, Missouri, was the essayist "On the 13<sup>th</sup> Day of Christmas: Singing and Understanding the Hymns of Epiphany" entitled "Origins, Scripture, and Themes of the Season of Epiphany".

# **District President's Report**

President Bertsch's report was based on the theme verses from Philippians, citing the many reasons the district has to rejoice in the Lord. As part of his report, President Bertsch shared the results of his study of hymns versus songs used in the congregations of the North Dakota District and pledged to work with congregations and pastors to refrain from using songs with false theology. **Recognition of New Members to Synod**

#### **Teaching in a Simple Way**

The first words of Luther's Small Catechism are, I think, often overlooked. They are, "As the head of the family should teach them in a simple way to his household." Yes, the early Lutheran Reformers, as well as Lutherans today, placed a high value on home instruction of God's truth, particularly from the head of the household!

This is Scriptural! We are told in Deuteronomy 6, "<sup>7</sup> You shall teach them diligently to your children, and shall talk of them when you sit in your house, and when you walk by the way, and when you lie down, and when you rise. <sup>8</sup> You shall bind them as a sign on your hand, and they shall be as frontlets between your eyes. <sup>9</sup> You shall write them on the doorposts of your house and on your gates."

Today we might call this Family Devotions! This can, at times, feel like a tall order, and as parents, we all find this a difficult part of our vocation. As a result, this clear commandment of the Lord often falls by the wayside. I think that there are a number of reasons why this happens.

- 1. **Too Busy.** This is probably the major reason why family devotion time suffers. Parents work a full shift, pick up the kids from school or daycare, and then by the time homework and dinner and dishes are done, its time for bed! When are we *supposed to do* family devotions? I would argue that one solution is, once again, to keep it *simple*. What does a simple devotion look like? This leads us to the next reason for lagging family devotions.
- 2. Where Do I Begin? Family devotions do not need to be a half-hour long. A mere 5-10 minutes right before bed may not seem like much, but over the course of a year that's 30 to 60 hours spent with your children in prayer and study of God's Word! This is an invaluable investment in a child's growing faith!

  To keep it simple, start simple:
  - o For younger children get a *Story Bible* book (BTW: the church is gifting those to parents this year!) Beginning with the first reading, read it aloud to your child and talk about the picture. Older children could read the appropriate passage from the Bible itself (usually referenced in the *Story Bible*!)
  - Recite a portion of the Small Catechism.
  - o Say the Lord's Prayer or Luther's Evening prayer together.

There is still one more reason that parents often avoid family devotions, and that is . . .

3. **Fear of Teaching Wrongly**. It think that this is a major reason for dwindling family devotion time in our society. Parents feel inadequate to the job. But who isn't? We are all imperfect in what we say and do at times. We are weak and simple people! Yet God still instructs *us* to teach our children "diligently." But consider the quote at the beginning of this article, "As the head of the family should teach them in a *simple way* to his household." Leading a family devotion does not require a degree from the Seminary! We teach in a simple way.

Will your children ask questions that you cannot answer? Probably. Kids do that all the time. And when that happens, simply tell your child that you don't know! Then on Sunday morning he can ask a Pastor about it. That is, after all, part of what we are here for!

This admonition is for all of us with children. As Proverbs 22:6 says, "Train up a child in the way he should go; even when he is old he will not depart from it." It is a weighty task, and we will certainly not carry it out with sinless perfection, but as Christian parents we are called to try. What better gift can we give to our children than the Gospel of Jesus, and through it forgiveness, life and salvation?
