



## Witnesses to Christ: People from His **PASSION**

John tells us why he wrote his Gospel: "Jesus did many other signs in the presence of the disciples, which are not written in this book; but these are written so that you may believe that Jesus is the Christ, the Son of God, and that by believing you may have life in His name" (John 20:30-31). Life! When we believe that Jesus is the Christ, God gives us life abundant life, forgiven life, and eternal life.

Historically, the Fourth Gospel is likened to an eagle—an image that suggests John soars to heights of glory and grandeur. That's because the evangelist paints a stunning portrait of Jesus, who is the bread of

life, the resurrection and the life, and the way, the truth, and the life. Life in Jesus. That's God's gift to you!

## The Mission Field is in Our Own Backyards

You've probably seen those signs, usually posted at church exits, or in parking lot exits that say, "You are now entering the mission field!" These signs are true! Often when we think of mission work, we think of missionaries who have been sent to distant lands. We think of African or Latin American missions. Truly, the first thought that comes to mind is usually not America. And yet, western culture is falling into paganism and secularism at an alarming rate, and in many ways I think our culture is more spiritually destitute than some of the places where we are sending missionaries. This spiritual desert is where our children are growing up. It is what they call "home." I want to make the point in this month's newsletter that perhaps the most critical mission field for Christians today is literally in our own backyards! It is our children.

Last month's newsletter article addressed the importance of family devotions. Indeed, they are important, not only for our own spiritual strength, but also for our children. Scripture tells us to, "Train up a child in the way he should go; even when he is old he will not depart from it." (Prov 22:6) That being said, churches are nevertheless losing their children in mass numbers. It is no secret that a large percentage of our 8<sup>th</sup> grade confirmands rarely come to the Divine Service after Confirmation. It is a problem. So, what can we do?

- 1. First and foremost, we can and should pray. We should pray daily for the spiritual well-being of these precious gifts that God has given us! They are, without a doubt, targets of our enemy, the devil. They are bombarded with all kinds of ideas every day on social media, through movies and television, and in the school system via peers and antagonistic educators. And so we must pray.
- 2. We need to bring our children to Sunday School and the Divine Service. Yes, the Divine Service may, at times, not be the most *exciting* thing for 2 year old, but they understand more than we give them credit for. They are like little sponges, absorbing everything they see and hear. And what do they see and hear? They see mom and dad and grandparents and friends worshipping Christ. But most importantly, they hear the Word of God! And faith will grow.
- B. We continue the practice of regular family devotions.
- 4. We support our Lutheran Schools. (BTW: Martin Luther School is expanding next year to 6th grade, with an eye on 7<sup>th</sup> and 8<sup>th</sup> grade in the next few years!)

At the end of the day, we realize that the salvation of our children does not depend on us. Scripture tells us that "neither he who plants nor he who waters is anything, but only God who gives the growth." (I Cor 3:7) At the same time, God has called us to plant and water. So plant and water we will.

Lord give us wisdom to raise our children in your Word, and help us and forgive us when we fail.
