What Makes for a Cheerful Giver?

St. Paul wrote to Church of Christ in Corinth: "Each one must give as he has decided in his heart, not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver" (2 Cor. 9:7). God loves a cheerful giver. But who is a cheerful giver?

Abel was. By faith, he gave the firstborn of his flock, and it was acceptable in God's sight. Abraham was. By faith, he prepared cakes and a tender choice calf for God and entertained angels unaware. So also were David and Solomon. By faith, David would not make a sacrifice to God that cost him nothing, so he paid Araunah his due. By faith, Solomon built a house for God, where his name would dwell and thereby where He would dwell to be Israel's God and they His people.

What more shall we say? For time would fail us to tell of all those who gave not simply for the joy of giving but for the joy of knowing the One to whom they gave.

So also our Lord, who for the joy set before Him, gave everything – yes, even His life – enduring the cross and scorning its shame. He gave to the shedding of His blood, willingly and resolutely setting His face toward Jerusalem to die for the life of the world. Though He was rich in every way, He became poor, so that by His poverty, we might be rich beyond measure.

So then, let us like Abel and Abraham, like David and Solomon, and even like our Lord Jesus Christ, give cheerfully to God for the work of His kingdom in our midst. Like them, let us decide in our heart for the joy set before us. It's the joy of knowing the One to whom we give is the One who gives us all good things.





Jesus left the temple and was going away, when his disciples came to point out to him the buildings of the temple. But he answered them, "You see all these, do you not? Truly, I say to you, there will not be left here one stone upon another that will not be thrown down." Matt 24:1-2

Background

In 33 AD Jesus predicted the destruction of the temple in Jerusalem. In 70 AD it was fulfilled with the attack on Jerusalem by the Roman Empire. Over the next 1878 years, the Jewish people were scattered around the world, with no homeland. In 1948, after the Holocaust under the Nazis and the murder of about 6,000,000 Jews, the modern nation of Israel was formed. Of course, there were already Palestinians living there, many of which were removed and displaced by the mass migration of Israelis to the region. This is, at least, part of the history behind the recent atrocities committed in Israel by the Hamas terrorists. Now we have increasing division regarding whether Hamas is the villain, or whether it is Israel that is the true aggressor. How are we, as Christians, supposed to deal with this?

Are we expected to support national Israel at all costs?

If you listen to Christian radio you will no doubt hear the claim that we are obligated to support Israel at all costs, or else fall under a curse. This idea likely comes from Genesis 12:13 and Numbers 24:9. In Numbers we read this regarding Israel: "Blessed are those who bless you, and cursed are those who curse you." So what are we to make of this? Are we Biblically required to support anything and everything that modern day Israel does?

The answer to this is "No." This is not to say that we should not support Israel in the current war in Palestine, it is simply to say that scripture does not require us to support the Nation of Israel as it stands today. But what about the passage in Numbers above that says that we will be cursed if we don't? To answer this I want to consider a few things.

#1 God Himself, at times, sent enemies to attack and destroy national Israel.

Reading Jeremiah 7, we see that the people in his day had fallen into grave idolatry and sin. God asked them "Will you steal, murder, commit adultery, swear falsely, make offerings to Baal, and go after other gods that you have not known, and then come and stand before me in this house, which is called by my name, and say, 'We are delivered!'-only to go on doing all these abominations?" (Jer 7: 9-10, ESV) We also read that they had "built the high places of Topheth, which is in the Valley of the Son of Hinnom, to burn their sons and their daughters in the fire." (Jer 7: 31a, ESV) As a result of this rampant infanticide and adulterous, sexually depraved Baal worship, God had declared that destruction was coming at the hands of the Babylonians. But there is one more interesting observation. God gives Jeremiah the following instructions. "As for you, do not pray for this people, or lift up a cry or prayer for them, and do not intercede with me, for I will not hear you." (Jer 7: 16, ESV) Taking this into consideration, it is clear that people are not required to support every little thing that national Israel does simply because they are dscebded from Abraham! So what does Numbers 24:9 mean? This brings me to my second point.

#2 The command to bless and not curse Israel is NOT talking about national Israel, the country!

We are to bless and not curse Israel, but who is Israel? Israel is not a genetic or biological entity. It is not about bloodline. Israel is, and always has been, those who believe in and trust the true God. Was Ruth, the great-grandmother of King David, a genetic Israelite? No. She was a Moabite. Rahab, who also became a distant grandmother of David, was also a Canaanite. These became Israelites by faith As the scripture says "⁷Know then that it is those of faith who are the sons of Abraham. And the Scripture, foreseeing that God would justify^[a] the Gentiles by faith, preached the gospel beforehand to Abraham, saying, "In you shall all the nations be blessed." So then, those who are of faith are blessed along with Abraham, the man of faith." (Gal 3: 7-9, ESV) Elsewhere we read "For not all who are descended from Israel belong to Israel, and not all are children of Abraham because they are his offspring, but "Through Isaac shall your offspring be named." This means that it is not the children of the flesh who are the children of God, but the children of the promise are counted as offspring." (Rom 9:6b-8, ESV) Israel is, and always has been, those who are Israel by faith. That would include all of the saints of the Old Testament (the Gentiles Rahab and Ruth, along with David, Elijah, and the prophets) as well as the saints of the New Testament, that is, the Church. So what about God's promise to Abraham "³ I will bless those who bless you, and him who dishonors you I will curse, and in you all the families of the earth shall be blessed?" (Gen 12:3, ESV) This is about US. This is in reference to all the saints, not the modern day country of Israel. This month we observe All Saints day. And who are the saints? They come from every tribe and nation! This is the spiritual Israel that we are obliged to support!

Final Thoughts

So what about the current situation in the Middle East? It seems that, once again, our country is divided. Some support Israel's retaliation against Hamas, others do not. This is a political issue, and it is not my calling to tell you what you ought to think or who you ought to support. My calling is to tell you what scripture teaches, and scripture does NOT teach that we are required to support "national Israel" at all costs. National Israel rejected Christ a long time ago, and as such, we consider them, politically, as we would any other country. We may support, or not support them based on a range of political and ethical reasons, but not because the country formed in 1948 is somehow God's special people! The church, on the other hand, is, and always will be His special people in Christ.
