Has tracks for students in a variety of fields: the trades, teaching, music and pre-seminary.


Has a campus culture that nourishes life-long friendships, forms the faith in students and builds up godly mothers and fathers.

The college is breaking ground this Summer on the new campus on a beautiful tract of land at the foot of Casper Mountain in Wyoming.



# Women's Bible Study Coming In September



God Words: Part 1
What are they?

This month's article is the first in a series called "God Words." What do I mean by *God words*? God words are religious words that are used so frequently in the church and in the culture at large, that their actual Biblical meaning has often become misunderstood. The devil has a fine way of taking words and trying to change, twist, or cloud their meaning. Why is this? Because it breeds confusion. This is bad enough when we confuse the meanings of neutral words, but when it comes to words of eternal importance (words that we will be referring to as "God words") the consequences can be spiritually fatal. Some of the words that I want to discuss over the next several months are:

- 1. God
- 2. Love
- 3. Faith
- 4. Heaven
- 5. Good
- 6. Truth
- 7. Sin

The problem with these words is that most people in the world think they know what these words mean, but in actuality, if pressed to actually define them, they would quickly find that their assumed definitions are either overly simplistic or else completely wrong. This is, by the way, no new problem. The ancient Greek philosopher, Plato, in his dialogues, attempts to define these words. If you have never read any of his dialogues, I would recommend it, because what he demonstrates is that human beings have a serious problem defining words like these. Our definitions are riddled with contradictions and non-sense!

Left to our own, we seem to be unable to really properly define these God words. But words like God, love, faith, heaven, good, truth, and sin are the very words that we most need to understand! Our lives literally depend on it. Why are we so foolish as to seemingly be unable to explain the meanings of such apparently simple words?

In Romans 1 Paul writes about the fall of humanity into sin. One of the results of this is foolishness.

<sup>21</sup> For although they knew God, they did not honor him as God or give thanks to him, but they became futile in their thinking, and their foolish hearts were darkened. <sup>22</sup> Claiming to be wise, they became fools, <sup>23</sup> and exchanged the glory of the immortal God for images resembling mortal man and birds and animals and creeping things. (Rom 1: 21-23, ESV)

Of course, the real foolishness here was turning away from the true God to false ones. But with it, I would argue, we also lost a firm grip on the truth. Our thinking is clouded and murky. We are stumbling around in the dark, unable to find the truth or even define what the word truth really means. So how do we find it? It is shown to us.

Scripture says in Psalm 119: 105: "Your word is a lamp to my feet and a light to my path." Jesus, the Word made flesh also says, "I am the light of the world. Whoever follows me will not walk in darkness, but will have the light of life." (John 8:12, ESV)

Indeed, our only hope of really understanding these critically important God words, is through scripture itself. God must tell us! Next month I plan to discuss the first of these God words: God. When someone says, "I believe in God." What does that mean? If asked to define "God", I think one would get a lot of *different* answers. This is a problem, because there are *not* a lot of *different* Gods. There is only one who saves: The God of scripture!
